# SIPP Collaborates with the University of Maryland Environmental Cooperation and the Israel-Hamas War Virtual Program - April 25, 2025 at 1pm EDT/11am MDT



SIPP has been working with the University of Maryland's Gildenhorn Institute for Israel Studies to offer a program on environmental peace-building in Israel and Palestine. This virtual program will address the environmental dimension(s) of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict in the context of the ongoing

Israel Hamas war.

This is SIPP's first collaboration with the University of Maryland (UMD), and we hope it will lead to additional opportunities to collaborate with UMD as well as

## **SIPP Mini-Grants**

#### 2024 Mini-Grants



Despite the challenges presented by the current outbreak of violence since October 7, 2023, and **with your support**, SIPP recently awarded mini-grants totaling \$17,500 for seven very worthy projects. Due to the current situation, most applications

were from Israeli-based organizations. Three of the new mini-grants address relationships between Israeli Bedouin and Jewish communities. Participants in the programs include children, high school students, young adults, and women. These are the 2024 mini-grant recipients:

- 10th Grade YOUNITED Programme, Givat Haviva International School (GHIS)
- Sport in the Service of Peace, Peres Center for Peace and Innovation
- Connecting through Roots Challenge. An organization for conflict transformation
- "Turning Point" Exploring identities and getting to know the 'other'
   Palestinian Bedouins of the Negev and their Jewish Neighbors,
   Desert Stars
- Non-formal Hebrew education through play & sports for young children in home courtyards of unrecognized Bedouin villages, Riffman Institute
- Desert Eyes, Ramat HaNegev Regional Council
- Fallahi Multicultural event production- Elham The Day After,
   Elham-The Day After

#### 2 023 Relief Grants

Shortly after October 7, 2033, SIPP invited organizations to submit informal applications for Relief grants of up to \$2000 for small projects involving multicultural work. SIPP awarded three grants to two organizations:

- The Ein Bustan Waldorf preschool/kindergarten in Israel's southern
  Gallilee region used funds to build a safe room to protect Jewish and
  Arab students and staff from rocket fire from Syria and Lebanon.
- Keshet, an organization located in Mitzpe Ramon (Negev Desert) which provides services to Jewish and Bedouin communities in the region, used funds to purchase 340 of the first aid kits which it delivered to 420 Bedouin participants in 12 first aid courses. It also provided artistic cultural activities for Israeli evacuees in conjunction with the local Jewish and Bedouin residents.

#### 2024 Mini-Grants - Second Round

We are in the process of having a second round of 2024 mini-grants and will be opening up our application period in the next few weeks! # 2023 Jim Swaeby Peace Award



In September, barely a week before the Hamas attack in October, SIPP President Peter Ornstein and SIPP Secretary Beth Ornstein were named the 2023 recipients of the Boulder

Rotary's Jim Swaeby Peace Award for their work with Sustainable Israeli-Palestinian Projects.

The award recognizes outstanding achievement for "the advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world of fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service."
